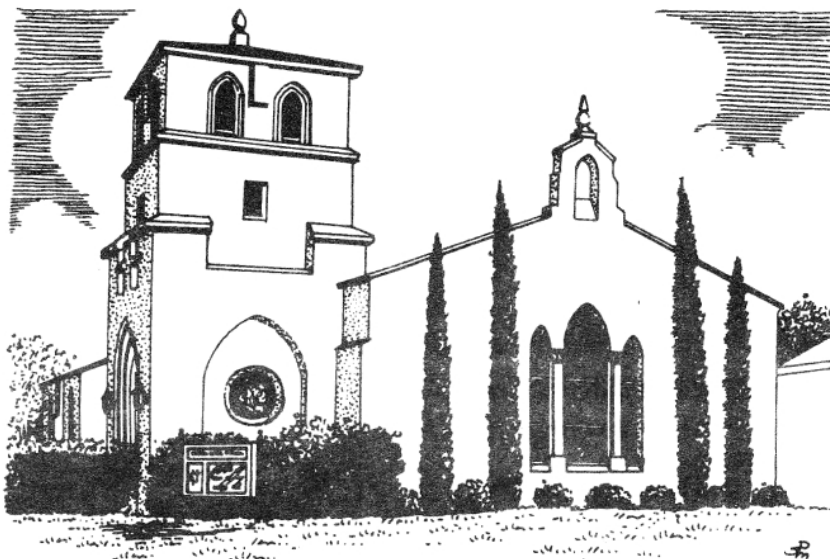

## *A Word from Don*

September, the end of summer, brings with it a surge of power. It seems as though the long, intense heat of summer days builds to a swell of unleashed activity: hurricanes and storms pop up and rake through our vicinity with more frequency, an earthquake rattles much of the eastern part of our country, political agenda heats up anticipating new elections, and personal relationships intensify through often misunderstood intentions. Is this a new trend? Not really. The history of mankind has been impacted every season by the power of change. The power of life is the power of change. All of creation undergoes change, even rocks. We are all subject to the evolution of life shaped by the natural, and sometimes un-natural, circumstances we encounter. So many of these encounters we have little control over, but many we can prepare for, and this preparation nearly always involves flexibility. Strong winds will break the rigid tree, but the one that can bend will remain. We cannot isolate ourselves from change, run from it, or hide from it. It will find us. We cannot be free from it, but we can be free *in* it. This freedom only comes in an ongoing, deepening, daily relationship with Jesus Christ.

Sometimes I think the historical church of Jesus Christ has become rigid, institutionalized to the point of breaking. Very often, attempting to do the same things in a changing environment creates a resistance that can become dangerously inflexible. Certainly many denominations have realized this, and become flexible in the practice and discipleship of Jesus while standing firm on the Rock of Jesus, the first and last, who was, and is, and is to come. Jesus never said “follow me *this way*.” He simply invited all who would to “follow me.” So then, where has Jesus led us? Where do we find ourselves? Are we close enough to reach out and touch him so we don’t lose our way in the maze of change?

As your new pastor I have embraced a great deal of change lately; city living rather than country living, new staff, new schedule, new friends, new environment, new ministries. I have had to let a lot of old ways and people go. “From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, Who made heaven and earth” (Ps 121). As I follow Jesus’ invitation, I discover over and over how exciting

change is, for “his mercies are new each morning.” The pastorate is not a job I do, it is a life I live, and the leadership I bring will spring from my spiritual life and my daily living with Jesus. Will there be change? Yes, undoubtedly. Do I know what this change is? No, not yet. However, I do know I will remain flexible to the Holy Spirit, the teaching of Jesus, and the love of the Father. Through the power of God’s gifts given me I will stand in Faith with you, I will worship through Creative Communication, Teach in diligence, and Intercede in Prayer for all.

I cannot wait to see where Jesus will lead us together. I sense his Holy Spirit on the move, worship to become even more exciting, Kingdom expansion through mission, giving in service and resources to increase with needs, and fellowship connecting all kinds of people. We have a lot of love to share with many under a load of care.

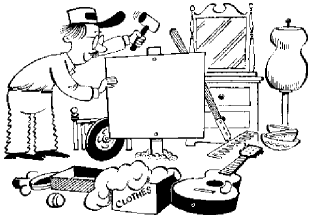

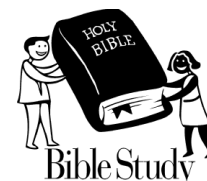

## Prayer Shawl Ministry

### Thankful for Prayer Shawl

Most of you know by now that my daughter, Nikki, lost her home and belongings in an early morning fire on February 8. What I want to share with you is the story of how a prayer shawl given to Nikki when her father died made such a difference in her life.

Nikki called me about twenty of five that morning and told me her house was on fire. She had her coat, her little dog, and her purse and she was outside. When I got there, four fire engines and twelve firefighters were doing everything they could to salvage her house. We were not allowed to go in until later that morning when the Fire Marshall came to determine the cause of the fire.

None of us were prepared for the loss that awaited us. John, Charlie and myself had been in Nikki's house the evening before to help her care for her new puppy. Nikki had taken such pride in fixing up her father's former home. Fresh paint, new windows, new appliances, new heat pump, and most of all the plants had transformed the house. I always came home wishing my house was as neat and clean (and uncluttered) as Nikki's.

When we were allowed to go in for the first time, I cannot describe what had happened. I know many of your lives have been touched by a fire, so you may understand what I am trying to speak about. Mr. Steve Lauderback, with the Greeneville Fire Department, was there and I said to him, "Oh, she has lost everything." Another gentleman was standing beside him. His response to me was this, "No, Ma'am, your daughter has everything today, she has her life." He asked us to just look at the room where Nikki had been sleeping when the fire alarm awakened her. As the firefighter pointed out,

everything in the room was damaged, the big screen television was melted, the ceiling fan was melted and hanging down, all of the paneling was burned and falling down, the pictures on the mantel were burned and melted, the other couch in the room, the covers were melted and you could see the springs, but yes, the love seat where Nikki had been sleeping was totally untouched. Not a blemish, and on top of that love seat was the precious Prayer Shawl that this congregation so lovingly gave Nikki in her time of loss. The next statement the firefighter made was this, "Except by the grace of God, your daughter is alive today. Had she been anywhere else in the house, she would have surely perished." Melissa Malinoski was there as well, and when we looked in the room, it was amazing that everything was damaged except where Nikki was sleeping.

I pray that fire never touches your life, but I wanted to share this with Abby and the folks who make the prayer shawls, and she in turn asked that I share this with our congregation. We never know the power of things made and given in love to those in need and I thank each person who participated in this ministry for the Prayer Shawls. When we picked up the few things we could that morning, Charlie went over and got the Prayer Shawl and he commented, "You know the church gave this to Mom when Papaw Charles died." I know Nikki will forever keep and treasure it and I thank you from the bottom of my heart for helping to care for my daughter.
