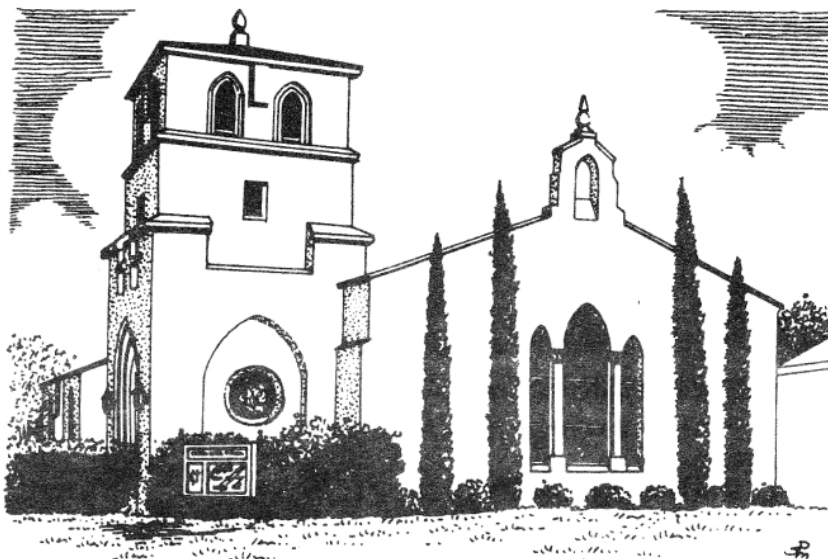

A Word from Don

Traditionally, October is a time to begin planning for the next year, a time to emphasize our call to stewardship in the Body of Christ, members of the Church. The stewardship of a believer is directly related to the pledge of loyalty we make as members of the church, through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness with Christ Jesus. These intentional actions fuel every attempt to “make disciples,” our “upward call in Christ Jesus.” These principles will be my study and preaching focus from the middle of the month all the way to Thanksgiving Sunday.

PRAYERS: Every faithful response to God’s grace is launched in prayer. Prayer draws into the very presence the Lord of life. Prayer is a partnership with God in Jesus’ name that initiates healing, restoration, revival, preaching, deliverance, freedom, praise, etc... Prayer is the power of God. We must be more intentional in prayer, and “pray without ceasing,” in every opportunity. Pray the Word of God, pray in the Spirit, and pray with others. This is the breath of life in the church. The Agape Fellowship meets at 8 AM most Tuesday mornings in study and prayer, and the Prayer Group at 1:30 PM on Wednesdays. Both meet in the Historical Room. Join or start a home study/prayer group, just pray for your church, each other, and the community.

PRESENCE: This simply means be in regular attendance in church, for worship, Bible study, times of fellowship, special programs and opportunities for training, and meetings necessary to carry out the ministries of the church. “They were continually devoting themselves to the apostle’s teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.” (Acts 2:42). This is the life of the church, and it is JOY.

GIFTS: God is the Giver of every good and perfect gift; the gift of the Holy Spirit to every believer. The Holy Spirit, then, reminds us of everything about Jesus, and convinces the believer of sin, righteousness, and judgment in all things (Jn 14:26; 16:8). God cannot be out-given, but that should not stop us from trying. Everyone I know is experiencing crises in their financial situation. Something very different is happening all around us. It seems all I hear about these days is money problems. Nothing, however, has changed about God’s ability and desire as Jehovah-Jireh (*God Provider*). He even provides the practical way to achieve plenty in all situations, the *tithe* (giving 1/10th of the first-fruits of our labor). This is one of the most misunderstood terms in the Bible. In my non-believer church days I often thought about this as some church self-imposed tax. But it is no tax. It is God’s blessing to every believer who will trust Him to provide for every need of life, and it is truly expressed in the Joy of giving it. You give the tithe in real joy, and God is over-joyed to provide everything else. It’s so hard to describe, like the very mystery of God, and must be experienced to be appreciated. The beauty and perfection of tithing lies in the percentage-giving principle it operates under. The ten percent (or whatever percentage you and God have agreed upon) always maintains the faithful response to God’s grace in your life. Oh, the amount of money may change as income does, but God’s faithful response never changes in His covenant relationship with you. “Test me now

is this!,” says the Lord, or “will a man rob Me?” (Malachi 3:8,9). As your pastor I tell you, if we all, as the Body of Christ, were to follow this single principle in faith, we would *never have to talk about money again!!!!*

SERVICE: The Holy Spirit, then, gives spiritual gifts to each believer as He will. These gifts are Divine empowerment to accomplish the will of God through the church and the various functions of the members. If some members are not functioning in these gifts, the Body cannot be whole, and actually becomes crippled. There are about 24 spiritual gifts that the Spirit of Jesus gives us to be the church, and no one person is gifted with all of them. So, obviously, we need each other to be whole and healthy, and even to function. The gifts have two functions only, to glorify God and to edify each other. Every gift is necessary to the church. Paul tells us, “Pursue love, yet desire earnestly the spiritual gifts, but especially that you may prophesy” (1 Cor 14:1). The gift of prophesy is “to comfort, encourage, and strengthen,” with the things of God and what they see Him doing, and not tell the future. The up-heaving time of life I believe we are experiencing calls us even more earnestly to obediently use these gifts knowing God will deliver us through them. We were born into “such a time as this” to serve Him with “all our heart and mind and soul and strength” and to “love our neighbor as ourselves.”

WITNESS: “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come down on you, and you shall be My witnesses...” (Acts 1:8). This is pretty straight forward, and interacts directly from these other principles above. A witness is simply to tell what he knows, sees, and hears God doing. It is not about us as individuals or personalities. Our witness encompasses and describes the transformed human heart that reaches out to others in love and encouragement. The world will not give this encouragement, it is sin-sick and only out for itself. The church must faithfully minister outwardly to others, and forget about trying to protect itself against the storm; God will do that if we remain faithful and obedient to him. ***If we will not honor God, He will not honor our church. However, if we will honor God, He will honor our church.***

In the next several weeks you will hear some good/bad news. I have been hearing from our leadership that we are in trouble, financially and otherwise. I have heard words like bankrupt and crises and other cries out to God. It seems like nearly every conversation begins or ends in money concerns. This is what the world is talking about, but it doesn’t need to be in our Kingdom of God plans. I’d like to end that conversation and begin one about the ministry of Jesus Christ, bring new life to a church that has a long standing reputation of faith and ministry. We are not a dying church unless we choose to lie down and give up. Let’s rally our worship and service in the spirit and truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ by living the fullness of life he has given us. Let’s respond in a resounding cry, **“THIS IS MY FATHER’S HOUSE!”** Let’s stand together and tell the **GOOD NEWS!** In Christ we are more than conquerors... Lead on Christ Jesus...

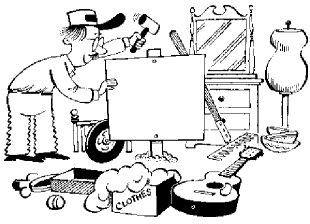
